Recently I've been re-reading one of the Christian writers who influences me, and he got me to doing some tough thinking. I'd like to share a few his thoughts and mine with you this month and ask you to think about some rather serious stuff. If you'd like a little bit of biblical background about where I'm going, take a couple of minutes read John 6:24-35. It might help this make more sense.

Now, here's what I'd like you to think about; and it's a fact of life. Everything – *absolutely everything* – we now own will be gone one day. Your Wedgwood, your crystal, your oriental rugs, your Lexus, your house, your computer, your entertainment console, your fancy phone, your CDs, your clothes: everything you and I now own will be gone – passed on, worn out, used up, destroyed, gone. It's a truth we can't dance around. You and I and our material possessions will perish.

But within this truism, a wise and caring voice – the voice of Jesus that I hope you read minutes ago in John's gospel – gives us a warning about not clinging to "food that perishes." What our Lord said was, "*Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of man will give you.*" (John 6:27, NRSV)

Jesus is telling us not to put our identity into material things, but rather to work for something that is not perishable, something that endures both here and into eternity. Like what? Things like justice, mercy, truth, forgiveness, fidelity, compassion, love: these are the enduring kind of things that Jesus had in mind, things that give deep joy on earth and in heaven.

Without exception, we and everything we now own will be gone someday. So consider this: since we will be left with nothing material that we now have, what will be our spiritual legacy?

The gospel challenges us repeatedly about things. Will we listen to, not questions about our material possessions and portfolios, but questions about our spiritual possessions and portfolios? You know, the familiar questions: did you feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit the imprisoned and the sick? These are the questions that resonate on earth and in heaven.

As I said, I've been thinking a lot about this recently. When I read that 1 of every 6 American families suffers from what is termed 'food insecurity' (not being sure where enough food will come from to feed their families) and the statistic world-wide is appalling beyond belief or even comprehension, I have to ask myself, "Can't I do a little more? Wouldn't Jesus want me to?"

I hope that you're having a good summer. See you in worship? May God continue to bless you and hold you close.

Secretary's Report was reviewed and accepted.

Treasurer's Report was reviewed and accepted.

Pastor's Report: No report. Pastor Cook was on vacation.

Old Business:

- The search committee is reading profiles.
- The copier lease contract is ready to be signed and we have coordinated with Comdoc to arrange wireless printing. The copier should arrive in a few weeks.
- The consistory has clarified some guidelines for the Scholarship.
 - The church scholarships use the interest from the scholarship investment. The maximum scholarship is \$500.00 per year per applicant. The applicants need to be a member in good standing.
 - The consistory has added a guideline for the church scholarship. Rachael Weigand made the following motion: The applicant can receive 100% of the yearly allotted amount if they are enrolled in an accredited college/university and 50% of the allotted amount if attending continuing education courses. Motion carried.

New Business:

- The website server space is close to reaching the memory limit so May Sweet has deleted some older sermons. We are upgrading the wireless router.
- Vacation Bible School has been changed to June 17th - June 21st.
- The treasurer is looking at some of the older Memorials and moving the money to current accounts like the scholarship investments.
- Harriet Neiser attended this consistory meeting to discuss some questions and ideas concerning the church's constitution and by-laws.

- We have 16 gallons of paint to cover the parking lot posts.

Elders: The Elders met on April 23rd. They are purchasing portable communion kits for home communion.

Stewardship & Missions: The May change for change collected \$266.00 for the community garden. The mission for Vacation Bible School will be the Doylestown Food Pantry.

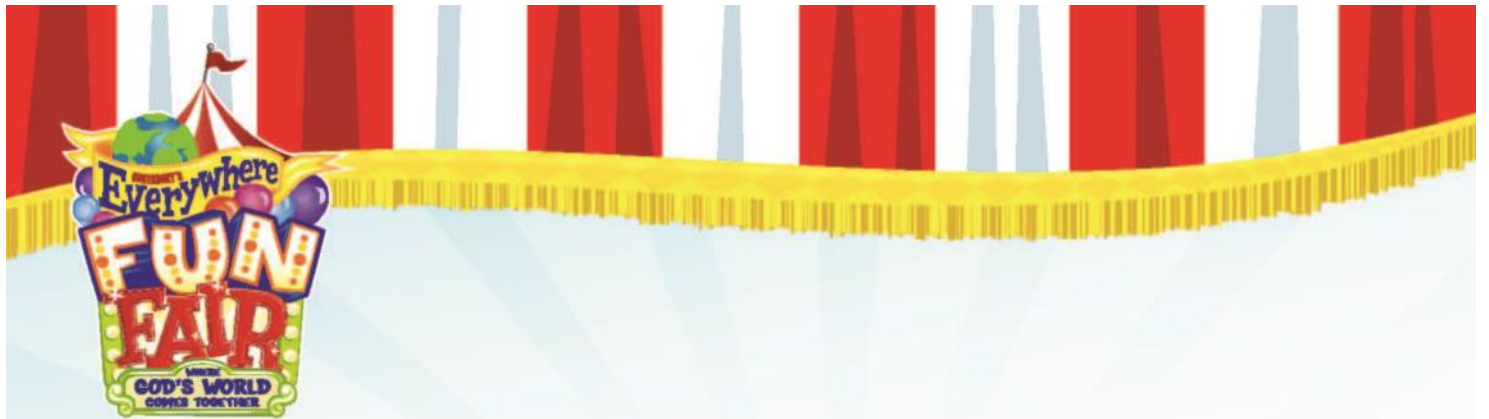
